De Beers Canada Inc (DBCI) was formed in 2005 and is a member of the De Beers Family of Companies. DBCI consists of three divisions: corporate, exploration and mining.

DBCI operates the underground Snap Lake Mine in the Northwest Territories (2008) and the open pit Victor Mine in northern Ontario (2008). DBCI is also the majority owner (51%) in the Gahcho Kué Project, a proposed open pit mine in the Northwest Territories.

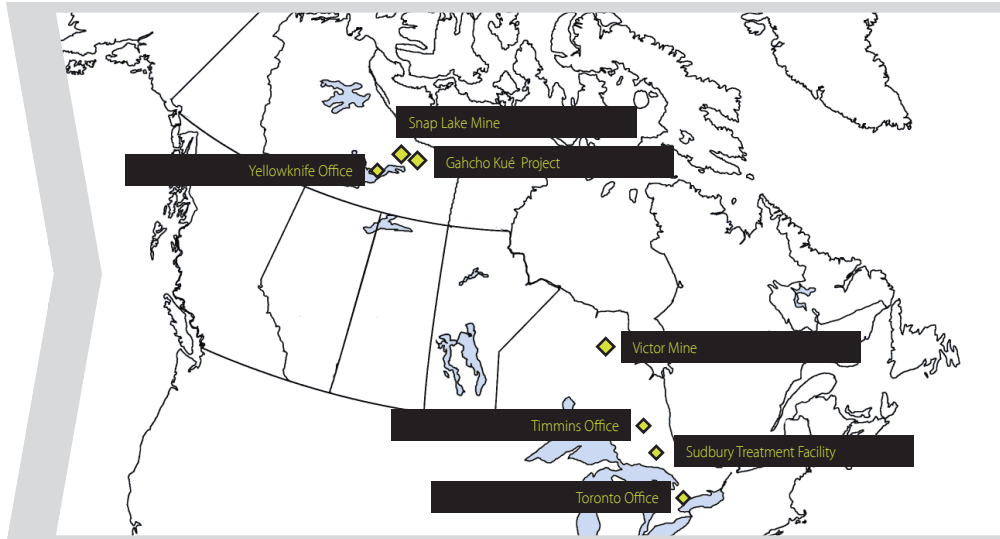
